PyCon AU is Australia's national conference for developers using the Python programming language and is a must-attend event for hundreds of technologists worldwide. In 2024, the conference returns to Melbourne, hosted at the premier event space in the city - the Melbourne Convention and Exhibition Centre.

The Python programming language is one of the most popular programming languages in the world due to its versatility and ease-of-use. It is the second most widely used language on GitHub, and usage is growing at a rate of 20% per year globally¹. Python is widely used in AI development, Data Engineering, Web Development and Education.

The PyCon AU community prides itself on being warm, inclusive and welcoming to everyone, at any level of experience. Our speakers range from industry veterans, to first-time speakers. The PyCon AU community has seen strong growth over its 14 year history, and is recognised nationwide for its leadership in creating accessible opportunities for all technologists – especially for under-represented communities.

PyCon AU is a labour of love, run independently by an all-volunteer team. The legal and financial structure is provided by Linux Australia Inc., a not-for-profit body registered under the *Associations Incorporation Act (NSW) 2009*.

Specialist Tracks

Curated content from interest groups within the Python community hold their own individual ‘miniconf’ on Friday.

Main Conference

Invited local and international speakers will open and close each day, with the main conference schedule running in three tracks. Talks cover a wide range of topics, including technical deep-dives, high-level overviews, retrospectives and much more.

Selected talks and conference schedule should be published no later than September 2024.

Sprints

‘Sprints’ are open development spaces where attendees collaborate on open source. Sprints foster collaboration and mentorship between experienced maintainers and new developers across the open source ecosystem.

Sprints follow a free-form schedule self-organised by project maintainers, often sparked by talks & conversations across the PyCon AU long-weekend.

Outreach initiatives include a wide-ranging financial assistance scheme, and a call for papers process that focuses on providing a rich and diverse speaker list across many fields of interest.

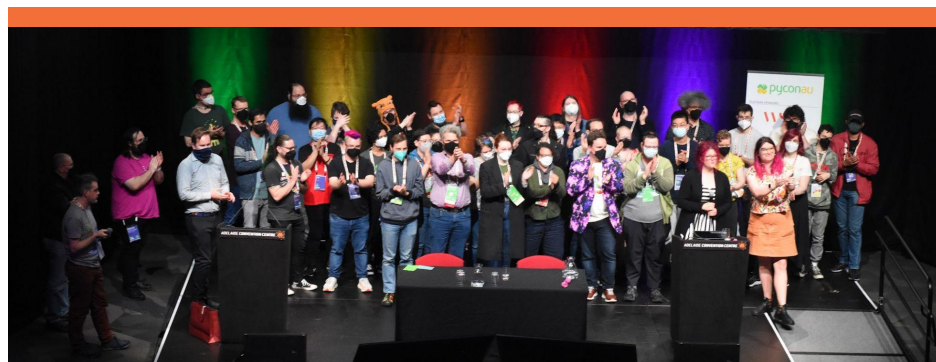
PyCon AU has an enforceable code of conduct, with all complaints treated confidentially and seriously.

We actively encourage our sponsors to submit² session proposals that bring value to our attendees.

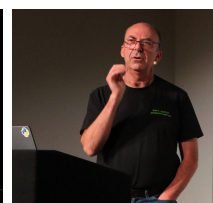
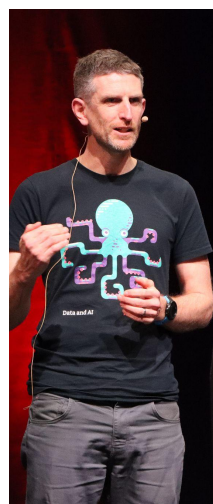
PyCon AU attendees are curious and actively looking for new and better ways to build, maintain and deploy their projects and products.

In 2024, we are pleased to offer pre-submission feedback and mentoring to sponsors for the first time.

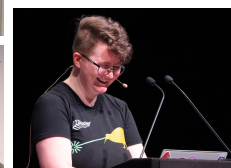
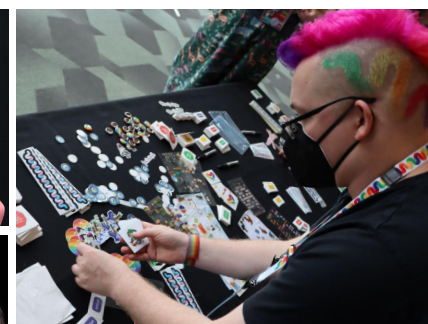
